**ADMINISTRATOR REPORT**

3. TNVR Presentation At this time Administrator Horner introduced Edie Offhaus (Feral Cat Focus), Joseph Smith (SUNY Buffalo Law) and Professor Kim Diana Connolly (SUNY Buffalo Law).

Joe Smith, a student at UB Law and member of the SUNY Buffalo Animal Law Pro Bono Project addressed all attending. Joe discussed the Trap, Neuter, Vaccinate and Release (TNVR) program as a way of controlling feral and community cats within the Village of Springville. With the assistance of Feral Cat Focus Joe feels that the Village would benefit immensely by endorsing the TNVR program.

After discussion, motion was made by Trustee Skelton, seconded by Trustee Moriarty; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Skelton, Moriarty, Chamberlin and Wikman voting yes to approving the below resolution.

WHEREAS, appropriate local laws addressing feral and community cats lessen the number of free-roaming cats, reduce annoyance and damage caused by feral cats, address potential disease concerns, and increase the quality of life for both citizens and cats by stabilizing the colony while allowing community cats to live out their lives outdoors; and,

WHEREAS, modern best practices to manage community cats uses the Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Return (TNVR) method, the only proven approach to stabilize and/or reduce existing feral and community cat populations and address potential disease concerns; and

WHEREAS, leading animal welfare organizations as well as the International City/County Management Association endorse TNVR of community cats; and

WHEREAS, several towns and villages in Erie County already have adopted laws allowing TNVR and have shown it to be a more cost effective treatment than euthanasia.

WHEREAS, the Village of Springville in 2009 incorporated TNVR in the Village policy to respond to complaints about unwanted community cats,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees hereby supports the practice of Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Return in the Village of Springville and encourages all municipalities to pass laws encouraging TNVR in accordance with appropriate guidelines; and be it further

RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution shall be transmitted to the Erie County Commissioner of Health and all parties deemed necessary and proper.

Furthermore, motion was made by Trustee Skelton, seconded by Trustee Wikman; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Skelton, Wikman, Chamberlin and Moriarty voting yes, none opposed to directing Village Attorney Paul Weiss to work with member of the UB Pro

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Bono Project on utilizing the TNVR program further in the Village and comparing it to the current Village policy and code.
