Deputy Mayor Skelton called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

1. Minutes

Minutes of the Regular Meeting of October 3, 2016 were approved as written by motion of Trustee Chamberlin, seconded by Trustee Wikman; carried, Deputy Mayor Skelton, Trustees Chamberlin, Wikman and Moriarty voting yes, none opposed.

Minutes of the Executive Session of October 3, 2016 were approved as written by motion of Trustee Chamberlin, seconded by Trustee Wikman; carried, Deputy Mayor Skelton, Trustees Chamberlin, Wikman and Moriarty voting yes, none opposed.

Minutes of the Joint Meeting of October 3, 2016 were approved as written by motion of Trustee Chamberlin, seconded by Trustee Wikman; carried, Deputy Mayor Skelton, Trustees Chamberlin, Wikman and Moriarty voting yes, none opposed.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Diane Fuller and Virginia Spengler, both of Pearl Street, addressed the Deputy Mayor and Board regarding teenagers roaming the neighborhood at all hours of the night and the possibility of a curfew. The Board thanked the women for their input. Officer Budney informed everyone that patrols have been stepped up and encouraged residents to call the

police every time there is a problem or concern regarding teens out during the night. Village Attorney Paul Weiss explained why a curfew would not be possible or the right answer for the Village of Springville.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

2. Amend Utility Rate Schedule After explanation by Administrator Melock, motion was made by Trustee Chamberlin, seconded by Trustee Wikman; carried, Deputy Mayor Skelton, Trustees Chamberlin, Wikman and Moriarty voting yes, none opposed to amending the Village of Springville Utility Rate Schedule to include a monthly \$1,300 meter charge for an 8" meter which is currently not in the rate schedule.

At this time Administrator Melock updated everyone on the following;

- The Halloween curfew will remain as it has in the past. In the business district and park the curfew is 7 pm and in the residential area it is 9 pm.
- The winter parking ban will remain as it has in the past. *(shown below)*
 1. Between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. from November 10 to April 1, the parking of vehicles is hereby prohibited on any street, and/or in any location adjacent to a street where the vehicle restricts and/or prohibits the Village of Springville from removing, plowing, and/or otherwise treating snow and ice within the street. For purposes of this section, the definition of street is provided in Section 150-13 of the Village Code.
 2. The parking of vehicles in the municipal parking lot is prohibited between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. from November 10 to April 1, except in designated areas within the municipal parking lot.
 3. No vehicle may be parked in excess of 24 hours in any one spot on any street, alley, or municipal parking lot, except in designated areas within a municipal parking lot.
- There will be a public meeting to discuss the proposed rate increase by National Fuel on 10/26/16 at 3 & 6pm at the Erie County Public Library, 1 Lafayette Square, Buffalo, NY.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

3. 4. '97 Materials Handler At the recommendation of Superintendent Kostowniak, motion was made by Trustee Chamberlin, seconded by Trustee Moriarty; carried, Trustees Chamberlin, Moriarty and Wikman voting yes, none opposed to award the following bid. After a public bid opening for 1997 Ford F800 material handler in the Electric Division that was previously

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declared surplus, be awarded to Gerwitz & McNeil Electric, Inc. in the amount of \$16,656. No other bids were received and the amount exceeds market value and trade in appraisal.

5. Permanent Appointments Upon the recommendation of Superintendent Kostowniak, motion was made by Trustee Chamberlin, seconded by Trustee Moriarty; carried, Deputy Mayor Skelton, Trustees Chamberlin, Moriarty and Wikman voting yes, none opposed to authorizing the permanent appointment of Colby Vandermeer to the position of Lineman B Apprentice effective 10/19/16.

Upon the recommendation of Superintendent Kostowniak, motion was made by Trustee Moriarty, seconded by Trustee Chamberlin; carried, Deputy Mayor Skelton, Trustees Moriarty, Chamberlin and Wikman voting yes, none opposed to authorizing the permanent appointment of Joshua Kerlin to the position of Laborer/Driver, Light Equipment Operator.
