2. Rezoning Dr. Timothy Siepel, the owner of three (3) parcels of property located at 34 Barnstead Drive, is looking to have the two parcels located at the back of the

property Rezoned from CIP to RM. He would be leaving the front parcel of property with road frontage on W. Main Street Zoned as CIP as recommended by the Planning Board on December 9, 2014.

The reason for the Rezoning would be to build apartments in the existing building. Dr. Siepel is looking to make the property more profitable.

# PROPOSED RESIDENTIAL RE-ZONE AREA

The current property located at 34 Barnstead Drive is currently zoned Commercial Industrial Park District ("CIP"). A "residential" use zoning ("RM") is being proposed to allow for the affordable operation of apartments in a former commercial building. The area south of 34 Barnstead Drive, the proposed rezone area, is currently zoned Residential. This change would allow Springville residents the ability to own and rent apartments on the subject property while maintaining the residential nature of Springville neighborhoods.

#### SPRINGVILLE ZONING MAP CHANGES

The proposed zoning map changes include re-zoning of certain areas within the Village of Springville to allow for the residential uses.

Permitted RM uses, as well as the permitted uses within other zones, can be found in Article IV of the draft of the proposed ordinance available during regular business hours at the office of the Springville Village Clerk.

At the aforesaid public hearing, the Village Board of the Village of Springville will consider the advisability of the proposed zoning change and also whether to declare itself lead agency for review under the State Environmental Quality Review Act, and also whether completion of an Environmental Impact Statement should be required.

All persons interested in the matter will be heard at the public hearing.

#### SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

Grant Update Ken Kostowniak has been searching for some grant opportunities and he found a grant offered through the DEC. It is called the Water Quality Grant 604B, and it is a funding source for Regional Economic Development Agencies. There are 10 Regional Development Agencies in New York State with Southern Tier West Group located in Salamanca being the closest one to the Village of Springville. Our plan is to be included in the Southern Tier West Group Application. The project we are presenting to them is the mapping of the storm water and sanitary sewer lines. If there is enough funding available, Mr. Kostowniak would also like to map all of our water lines as well. This mapping would be collected into GIS database where we could have everything collectively together on a map where we could quantify all of our assets and identify areas that need improvement such as, areas that have poor drainage, in a larger capacity and more efficiently.

The funding for this grant will be four (4) years and the matching of this grant is 90% - 10%. Our 10% of the cost will come from man hours. The mapping would be only the first phase of this Grant and would occur in the first year of the grant.

In the years going forward, the goal is to develop areas for green infrastructure and develop a Storm Water Mitigation Plan which is the ultimate goal. The Storm Water Mitigation Plan will provide supporting information for larger grant opportunities which would include Transportation and GIP Grants.

Ken Kostowniak is also applying for a grant through the Great Lakes Commission. This grant is specifically for putting infrastructure in the ground to clear ground water. He is hoping this will be awarded in time to help offset costs to the Franklin Street Project. This Grant is to clean sediment and phosphorous out of tributaries going into Lake Erie.

Mayor Krebs said that Community Development along with Economic Development is very important to the Village of Springville. grants help to offset the costs and make it possible for the Village to build our community.
