=> METAL LIDS, CLOSURE CAPS


HOW TO PREPARE:

Wash and place in recycling bin


DO NOT INCLUDE:

- o Aerosol cans, silverware
- o Propane cylinders, automotive parts
- o Metal cookware

RECYCLE:

=> REGULAR NEWSPAPERS

=> MAGAZINES

=> CATALOGS

=> PHONE BOOKS

=> JUNK MAIL

PREPARE:

Place loose in recycling bin

(NO STRINGS)

DO NOT INCLUDE:

- * Napkins, tissue paper
- * Wrapping paper, wax paper
- * Paper towels, or any food soiled paper


LEAVES, BRUSH, LIMBS

Leaves, brush and limbs are picked up the last two (2) working days of the month (April-October) unless otherwise advertised. Leaves and brush must be placed in containers and placed at the curb. Limbs must be placed parallel to the curb.

GARBAGE MUST BE PLACED IN BAG FOR PICKUP.

CARDBOARD



RECYCLE

=> BROWN CORRUGATED CARDBOARD

=> BROWN PAPER BAGS

=> BOX BOARD (CEREAL, GIFT AND SHOE BOXES)

PREPARE:

Remove large staples; metal or tape; flatten and bundle in 2' x 2' sections and place under recycling bin

DO NOT INCLUDE:

- o Pizza boxes, cardboard lined with foam
- o Items made of laminated sheets of paper or cardboard

WHITE GOODS

REFRIGERATORS, STOVES, WASHERS, DRYERS, FREEZERS, DISHWASHERS AND HOT WATER TANKS. These items should be put out on your regular garbage day. Waste Management will make a note of what's to be picked up and get it on a different day. If it's not picked up by the next week's garbage day call Waste Management.

GLASS



RECYCLE:

CLEAR, GREEN AND BROWN GLASS

=> FOOD AND BEVERAGE CONTAINERS

=> ONLY

PREPARE:

Wash, throwaway lids and rings, place in recycling bin

DO NOT INCLUDE:

- o Broken glass, windowpanes, ceramics
- o Light bulbs, mirrors, Pyrex, crystal

PLASTIC



RECYCLE:

=> MILK JUGS, SOFT DRINK BOTILES

=> LIQUID DETERGENT CONTAINERS

=> MILK/JUICE CARTONS & DRINK BOXES

=> #1,2,4 & 5'S

PREPARE:

Wash, throw away lids & rings, flatten if possible and place in recycling bin.

DO NOT INCLUDE:

- o Antifreeze/motor oil containers, Styrofoam, toys
- o Tableware, medicine bottles, plastic grocery bags

CHAPTER 45 (VILLAGE CODE)

(excerpts, full text available in Village office)

SOLID WASTE

All non-recyclables must be placed in a bag no larger than 33 gal. and have a NR STICKER (a serially numbered sticker with the Village of Springville's identifying imprint specially provided and sold by the village or its authorized resale dealers to be used for attachment to plastic bags containing non-recyclables for disposal).

- 33 gal. stickers cost \$2.50

- Stickers are available at the following locations:

NON-RECYCLABLES include but are not limited to:

Garbage - Putrescible solid waste, including animal and vegetable waste resulting from the handling, storage, sale, preparation, cooking or serving of foods, except grease generated from commercial establishments. "Garbage" originates primarily in home kitchens, stores, markets, restaurants and other places where food is stored, prepared, sold or served.

Rubbish - Rags, sweepings, excelsior, rubber, leather, crockery, shells, clothing, straw; dirt, filth, wastepaper, plastic, metal and wood scraps (unless listed on reverse side).

Large Household Furnishings - Large and/or bulky articles normally used in the home and which equip it for living, such as chairs, sofas, tables, beds, carpets and other such large household items.

Construction Debris - Waste resulting from remodeling or repair of structures or from new construction.

The following will not be picked up by the Village or any agency or agent thereof:

- * Hazardous waste as defined under regulations promulgated pursuant to §27-0903 of the NYS Environmental Conservation Law.

- * Source, special nuclear or by-product material, as

Low-level radioactive waste as defined in §29-0101 of the NYS Environmental Conservation Law; or regulated medical waste as defined under regulations promulgated pursuant to §27-1502 of the NYS Environmental Conservation Law. Animal carcasses.

The following items will not be picked up with the weekly garbage collection:

- Tires, rims

- Batteries, motor oil

- Paint

- Chemicals, pesticides

These items are picked up by Waste Management by special arrangements with the Village two (2) times a year, spring and fall, in the municipal parking lot. Waste Management charges a nominal fee for these items.

§ 145-4 COLLECTION

All waste material shall be separated, prepared for collection and collected in accordance with the provisions of this chapter. The Village of Springville shall have no obligation to collect and shall not collect or remove any waste material not prepared for collection in accordance with this chapter. The Village of Springville shall have no obligation to collect and shall not collect or remove any waste material placed for collection at or near the curb or edge of the street which was not produced or generated within the premises upon which it is so placed, and the placing for such collection of any garbage, rubbish or other waste material originating at a location other than the one upon which it is placed for collection is hereby prohibited.'

§ 145-5 Preparation of waste material for collection

No person shall dispose of waste material except as follows:

Containers and NR stickers

- Acceptable containers for recyclables, unless otherwise stated, shall be provided by the waste generator and shall be separate, galvanized or rigid plastic containers with two handles or a single rigid fall-away loop handle connected to opposite sides of the container. Such containers shall not exceed 33 gallons capacity and when filled shall not exceed 50 pounds in weight, including the container.

- Non-recyclables placed for pickup by the village or its authorized contractor shall be contained in a securely closed plastic bag having a capacity no greater than 33 gallons with an NR sticker firmly and permanently attached; or in the case of large non-recyclable items not able to be placed in such plastic bag, shall have an NR sticker securely attached to such item.

Items not meeting the above requirements will not be picked up.

NOTES FOR NON-RECYCLABLE ITEMS:

All parts of a single identifiable item of large household furnishings (such as a bed, chest of drawers, or sectional furniture) shall be considered one item requiring only one NR sticker for all of its parts.

Carpet shall be bundled and prepared for collection as construction debris.

Construction debris shall be placed in bags with NR stickers attached, or bundled in no more than 4 ft. lengths not to exceed 50 pounds per bundle, with a sticker attached to each bundle. All nails must be removed and all bundles securely tied with string or rope.

NOTES FOR RECYCLABLE ITEMS:

Recyclables can be co-mingled. Large appliances shall be prepared for collection by dismantling in such a way that they will not be a hazard to the public. Doors shall be removed before placing at the curb for collection.

§ 145-6 Collection

Garbage must be placed at the curb by 6:00 a.m. on scheduled date of pickup. No material may be placed at the curb before 6:00 a.m. of the day preceding the scheduled collection. Empty containers and their covers and any uncollected waste shall be removed from the curb by the occupants of the premises before the end of the day on which collection is scheduled.

§ 145-8 Limitations

No person shall place more than a total of eight (8) bags with NR stickers attached per week from a single residence or commercial establishment for collection. The limitation shall not apply to recyclable containers or materials.

§ 145-9 Prohibited disposal of garbage and trash

No person shall place, throw or deposit garbage, waste etc. on public property, or the private property of another person. No person shall bury or burn any garbage, waste, etc., within the village limits unless authorized to do so, in writing, by the Board of Trustees. No person shall store or accumulate garbage, waste, etc. unless stored in an acceptable container and promptly placed at the curb for collection in accordance with the requirements of this chapter. Up to three (3) compost piles, bins, are allowed if they are located in the rear yard of residential, commercial or industrial property and each has a base area of no greater than 64 sq. ft and is enclosed by wire, plastic, wood or other suitable material which adequately contains the compost.

§ 145-11 Disposal of garbage from outside the village

No person shall bring in garbage, trash, etc from outside the village for pickup by the village or its agents. No person living in the village shall allow anyone else to bring garbage, trash, etc. for pickup at their residence or commercial establishment.

§ 145-12 Penalties

Up to \$300. A violation of §145-11 is a misdemeanor punishable by six months imprisonment and/or a fine exceeding \$1,000.
