Mayor Krebs called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

1. Minutes Minutes of the Regular Meeting of October 18, 2021 were approved as written by Trustee Wikman, seconded by Trustee Skelton; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Skelton, Pazzuti and Braman voting yes, none opposed.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no Public Comment this evening.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

2. Amend Employee Handbook Motion was made by Trustee Wikman, seconded by Trustee Pazzuti; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Pazzuti, Braman and Skelton voting yes, none opposed to amend the Employee Handbook pg 12 Residency Policy to add "Effective 11-1-2021 add Lawtons" to the list of towns.

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3. New Public Safety Dispatcher PT Motion was made by Trustee Wikman, seconded by Trustee Skelton; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Skelton, Braman and Pazzuti voting yes, none opposed to appoint Paige Sultemeier to the position of Public Safety Dispatcher Pt effective immediately at a starting rate of \$13.25 per hour.
4. Dispatcher Wage Change Motion was made by Trustee Wikman, seconded by Trustee Skelton; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Skelton, Braman and Pazzuti voting yes, none opposed to increase the hourly pay rate effective October 31, 2021 of Public Safety Dispatcher Autumn Bunnell hourly rate to \$14.25 due to increase in our starting wages this fiscal year in the Control Center.
5. Amend DEC Consent Order Motion was made by Mayor Krebs, seconded by Trustee Wikman; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Braman, Pazzuti and Skelton voting yes, none opposed to authorize Mayor Krebs to Sign the amended DEC Consent Order #R9-20200415-28 granting an extension of two months to the original order.
6. NYMPA Board Vacancy Motion was made by Trustee Wikman, seconded by Trustee Pazzuti; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Pazzuti, Braman and Skelton voting yes, none opposed to authorize Administrator Melock to apply to the NYMPA (New York Municipal Power Agency) board of directors for the upcoming vacancy.
7. Hoch/Button Sewer Forgiveness After explanation by Deputy Clerk Holly Murtiff, motion was made by Trustee Wikman, seconded by Trustee Pazzuti; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Pazzuti, Braman and Skelton voting yes, none opposed to approving a \$180 sewer forgiveness to account #01-8400-01 as they have complied with all the requirements to request such.

Administrator Melock discussed with the Board the following;

- Election Notice in all 3 papers for Mayor and 2 Trustee positions. Nov 15th is the first day for Village to accept absentee ballot applications.
- Parking Ban effective Nov 10- April 1st on village streets and overnight parking in designated areas in Shuttleworth parking lot only.
- The WWTP bid will not be on 11/4/21 but will be on 11/12/21 at 10 am.

- The N. Central water main project has all the main in and had pressure testing done. They will start the interconnections this week. They are schedule to be done by the end of November.
- Eaton Park project has started and will as much done as possible before the weather turns bad.
- Skatepark is making steady progress. Should be putting in drainage and flat concrete work this week.
- The Streets Dept has started picking up leaves. They will continue until snow makes it not possible to pick up. We are asking residents to put leaves out by the road (no plastic bags) and not to mix brush or flower clippings in with the leaves.

9. Stop & Sight Line Study Resolution Motion was made by Mayor Krebs, seconded by Trustee Pazzuti; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Pazzuti, Braman, Skelton and Wikman voting yes, none opposed to authorize Mayor Krebs to sign and authorize the below resolution.

Resolution Supporting Erie County Highway Traffic Study Of the Buffalo Rd, N. Buffalo St, North St, Sharp St Intersection

WHEREAS, the intersection of Buffalo Road, N. Buffalo Street, North Street, and Sharp Street is located at the northern boundary of the Village of Springville; and

WHEREAS, this intersection bears much traffic from the Springville GI High School, the Springville GI Middle and Elementary Schools, the Springville GI Bus Garage, and the Children's League; and

WHEREAS, Vehicular and Pedestrian traffic pass through this intersection from the Village Center to the Concord Community Park and the Springville Field and Stream Trout Pond; and

WHEREAS, the angle of the roads present a visual challenge to approaching motorists and pedestrians; and

WHEREAS, the current signage is full stops east and west on North Street and south on Sharp Street with no signage control on Buffalo Road or North Buffalo Street; and

WHEREAS, the lack of traffic control creates Pedestrian as well as Motorist safety issues at this intersection; and

WHEREAS, an accident history of the intersection would show more than the average accidents for a Village intersection; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Village of Springville supports a traffic study of this intersection by the Erie County Highway Department to collect data for improved vehicular and pedestrian traffic design and signage.

10. Town of Concord Sewer Request

Central. The Town is requesting to connect to the Village sewer service to mitigate the current drainage and sewer situation at that location.
