The Regular Meeting of the Trustees of the Village of Springville was held online via Gotowebinar in Springville, New York at the above date and time. Present were:

Mayor Krebs called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

Mayor Krebs explained due to COVID-19 he prepared a powerpoint presentation for the board meeting and the village administrator would read the department head reports. The Mayor and Trustees were visible via webcams and the administrator and attorney were on the call with cameras off. The attending department heads were on the webinar but muted.

1. Minutes Minutes of the Regular Meeting of March 16, 2020 were approved as written by Trustee Chamberlin, seconded by Trustee Wikman; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Chamberlin, Wikman, and Pazzuti voting yes, none opposed.

PUBLIC COMMENT – moved to the end of the presentation. Only comment was thanking the board for having the webinar and being open to the public registering to attend.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS
ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

2. Electric Easement Roosa Motion was made by Mayor Krebs, seconded by Trustee Chamberlin; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Chamberlin, Wikman and Pazzuti voting yes, none opposed to authorizing the Mayor to sign all necessary and appropriate documents to effectuate an easement from Joseph B Roosa Living Trust and other documents for the Village's provision and maintenance of electrical service at the subject property – Wellnow.

3. Builders Agreement Wellnow Motion was made by Mayor Krebs, seconded by Trustee Chamberlin; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Chamberlin and Pazzuti voting yes, none opposed to approve and accept the Builder's Agreement for the Wellnow Project.
4. Appoint Emergency Manager Motion was made by Mayor Krebs, seconded by Trustee Chamberlin; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Chamberlin and Pazzuti voting yes, none opposed to appoint Gregory Stowell to the part time position of Emergency Manager at an annual salary of \$2,000 to be paid quarterly.
5. D&H Change Order Motion was made by Mayor Krebs, seconded by Trustee Wikman; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Chamberlin and Pazzuti voting yes, none opposed to approving change order for the TAP Grant Springville Bike Walk Project - \$77,400 portion of alternate #3 S. Buffalo St to D&H Excavating. Net change in the contract would be an increase of \$5,260.
6. Pole Attachment Firstlight Motion was made by Mayor Krebs, seconded by Trustee Wikman; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Chamberlin and Pazzuti voting yes, none opposed to authorize the Mayor to sign the pole attachment agreement with Firstlight.

Administrator Melock announced the following;

- Due to the recent COVID 19 crisis the village office is closed to the public but staff is available Mon-Fri from 8am-4 pm to answer questions and take payments. Phone and online payments are available along with the utility drop box. Garbage stickers can be purchased at Crosby Mart, Tops, Springville Hardware and thru the mail after payment is received. Last day to pay water-sewer is April 20th before the owed amount is relieved onto the village tax bill due July 1st.
- Village of Springville election date is still undetermined at this time but could be June 16th or June 23rd.

SUPERINTENDENT REPORT – read by Administrator Melock

7. Approve Annual Bids Motion was made by Mayor Krebs, seconded by Trustee Wikman; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Chamberlin and Pazzuti voting yes, none opposed to approving the annual bids to the lowest bidders from the bid date of March 20,2020. See attached list of the lowest bidders Awarded. Lawn mowing, concrete and sidewalks were put back out to bid for April 16th
8. Award SCADA Bid Motion was made by Mayor Krebs, seconded by Trustee Pazzuti; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Chamberlin, Pazzuti and Wikman voting yes, none opposed to awarding the bid for SCADA project to the lowest responsible bidder QEI, LLC 45 Fadem Rd Springfiled NJ 07081 for the SCADA system for the Springville Electric System in the amount of \$188,902.00 from the bid opening date of February 24, 2020.
9. Award Relays Bid Motion was made by Mayor Krebs, seconded by Trustee Chamberlin; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Chamberlin, Pazzuti and Wikman voting yes, none opposed to awarding the bid for for the North Street Substation Relay Panels to the lowest responsible bidder QEI, LLC 45 Fadem Rd Springfield NJ for the Springville Electric System in the amount of \$79,792.00 from the bid opening date of March 27, 2020.

At this time Superintendent Boberg wanted everyone updated on the North St. substation LTC repairs – started on March 30th and should be completed in a week to 10 days. Digester cover was moved into place on April 1st and H&K will finish within 2-3 weeks as long as we get warmer weather. Brush, limbs and leaf pickup will be on Monday and Friday each week in April. Leaves must be in containers with two handles not weighing more than 25 pounds.

approved.
