ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

2. TAP Grant At this time Administrator Melock announced that the Village of Springville has been awarded a NYSDOT TAP Grant in the amount of over \$482,000 to help with walk ability projects throughout the village. The total of the projects will be over \$603,000. There will be a public meeting this fall to discuss the different items in the projects.

- 5. CHIPS Funding Superintendent Kostowniak informed everyone that the Village of Springville will receive an increase in the amount of CHIPS funding received from the Consolidated Highway Improvement Program. These funds will be used for paving North Buffalo, North Street, oil and chipping of various streets in the Village, and a portion will cover new plow truck in the Streets Division.

In accordance with the provisions of § 180-5, no person shall make a turn of the kind designated below at any of the following locations:
