The Regular Meeting of the Trustees of the Village of Springville was held at the Village Municipal Building, 65 Franklin Street, Springville, New York at the above date and time.

1. Minutes Minutes of the Regular Meeting of June 4, 2018 were approved as written by Trustee Chamberlin, seconded by Trustee Wikman; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Chamberlin, Wikman and Rose voting yes, none opposed.

Executive Session Minutes of June 4, 2018 were approved as written by Trustee Wikman, seconded by Trustee Chamberlin; carried Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Chamberlin and Rose, voting yes, none opposed.

PUBLIC HEARING

2. 37 S. Central Mayor Krebs opened the duly advertised public hearing regarding 37 S. Central Avenue.

Steven Weber addressed the Mayor and Board regarding his property at 37 S. Central Ave. Mr. Weber gave multiple excuses on why he could not attend to his property at 37 S. Central. They included Calcium drain that caused his back to break, chemicals at a job made him sick, winter weather, past remodeling that was started in the structure caused some of the damage, contractor hired last year has dementia, Mr. Weber was in a car accident and work on other property in Gaslight Village in Wyoming County.

Mr. Weber stated the building will be repaired and introduced his engineer, AJ Petrilli Jr. which he has known for a year. Mr. Petrilli worked on property in Rochester this past year per Mr. Weber. Mr. Petrilli Jr. is a Structural Engineer with Petrilli Engineering. Mr. Petrilli walked through the property with Mr. Weber just prior to this evening's Board meeting. Mr. Petrilli stated that he felt the property could be saved but needed immediate "shoring up" of the outside wall. Mr. Weber expressed his desire to get the power turned back on. DPW Superintendent Ken Kostowniak explained the items in his letter from Ken need to be addressed before power will be turned back on. Mr. Weber said he did not receive a letter. Mayor Krebs explained that 37 S. Central is an extremely distressed property that is ready to be demolished. Mayor read the timeline of notices sent to Mr. Weber since spring 2011, which he has done nothing with. Mayor was upset that Mr. Weber waits until the day of the hearing to determine if his property at 37 S. Central should be demolished to come to the village without a plan, drawings or any contracts in place. Trustee Chamberlin asked Mr. Weber what his time frame was to fix the 9 issues cited in the May 8, 2018 Notice to Remedy. Mr. Petrilli stated it would take months to get plans in place. Mr. Weber stated he would put a new roof on and supports. Trustee Chamberlin wanted an answer from Mr. Weber on why 37 S. Central should not be taken down since it is an eyesore and has been for a very long time. Mr. Weber was asked by the Mayor when he started remodeling and he was unsure. After further discussion the conclusion was the property started to deteriorate and has been in need of repair starting in the 1980's and then nothing happened. Deputy Mayor Nils Wikman lived next door to the property until 1997 and there was never anything done to the property except the lawn being mowed. Never any tenants or paint or windows being addressed. Deputy Mayor wanted to know why we would believe Mr. Weber that this property would ever be addressed. Trustee Chamberlin wanted to know what the estimated cost of repairs were. Estimate given was \$30-40 thousand to put new roof on and substantial work to left side of property. Engineer stated that would be for a new roof and rafter replacement. Trustee Chamberlin pressed the timeline again since it is almost July and Mr. Weber still needs engineering drawings along with a contractor. Neither of these items is set up yet. Mr. Weber said the plans are in his head and he wants to make things right. Trustee Rose asked if the basement is dry. Mr. Weber stated there is water in there now since there is no power. Deputy Mayor said for at least 21 years that he knows of nothing has been done to this property and the cost would be well over \$100,000. Village Attorney Paul Weiss explained that Mr. Weber was noticed to court multiple times and did not appear each time. Mr. Weber said he was in a car accident. Attorney Weiss said that the court received one doctor note allowing Mr. Weber to miss court for one time since December 2017. Attorney Weiss also stated that Mr. Weber chose to work on properties in Rochester instead of his property here in Springville. Mayor and board was upset and outraged that Mr. Weber comes to this very important hearing asking for more time when he has not complied with the notices to remedy his property at 37 S. Central for many years. Mr. Weber has put the board in a difficult situation as this property is not safe. Discussion by the board on conditions to keep the structure from being voted on to demolish tonight.

Fire Chief Dave Klenk addressed the Board with his concerns for the SVFD firefighters should any emergency ever happen at 37 S. Central Ave. Fire Chief is appalled that this has taken so long to get to this point.

At 7:50 pm the Mayor and Board closed the Public Hearing and discussed the matter at hand. All Board members and Village Attorney Paul Weiss discussed the property.

On a motion by Trustee Chamberlin seconded by Deputy Mayor Wikman the following resolution was approved on June 18, 2018:

Whereas a public hearing was held on June 18, 2018 in regards to the current status of the property at 37 S. Central owned by Steven Weber,

Whereas Steven Weber was given an opportunity to speak in regards to his property at 37 S. Central as per Chapter 77 Buildings, Unsafe of the Village of Springville building code,

Whereas the Board of Trustees has determined that the buildings are unsafe (house and garage) as per the reports of the Village of Springville Code Enforcement Officer and the Engineering Report from Encorus Group dated April 30, 2018,

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, the Village Mayor and Board of Trustees recommends the structures be demolished and all costs associated with the demolition be levied on the property.

Unless, on the condition that the owner provides to the satisfaction of the Village a Performance Bond of no less than sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) within seven days from June 18, 2018 along with an engineering statement by a certified engineer that 37 S. Central can be made safe within fourteen days from June 18, 2018, plans for the repairs are due to the village code enforcement officer by fourteen days from June 18, 2018 and all of the items addressed in the Notice of Remedy dated May 8, 2018 from the Village of Springville be completed by September 1, 2018. Fences and barriers shall be placed on the property to secure the site and protect the public. The owner will comply with Village Code Section 77-3 requiring tenants in building by October 1, 2018 and other such other necessary requirements as set by the village. Failure to meet any of these deadlines will result in forfeiture of the performance bond to the Village and the demolition of the structures on said property.

- Milling and paving of Franklin and Church Street will start the week of 6/25/18 weather permitting.
 - Chipping of streets is scheduled sometime week of 6/25/18 also. Streets to be chipped are: Commerce, Forest, Elk, Childs, Smith, Depot, East Hill Run, and Chapel.
 - Mill St storm drainage shared service agreement was approved by Erie County Legislature (6-0 passed). Village is expected to start installation of storm sewer in July.
 - CATT county DPW road closure
 - United Survey will begin televising sanitary sewers mid-July. This is the pre-cctv'ing to determine and confirm lining areas. Preliminary estimate will be ~\$461,610.00 for televising, lining sewer mains and re-instating laterals.
