The Special Meeting of the Trustees of the Village of Springville was held at the Village Municipal Building, 65 Franklin Street, Springville, New York at the above date and time. Present were:

Mayor Krebs called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

PUBLIC HEARING

1. 2018 CDBG Application Mayor Krebs opened the public hearing regarding the 2018 Community Development Block Grant application. After discussion and there being no comment from those attending the meeting, motion was made by Trustee Wikman, seconded by Trustee Chamberlin; carried, Mayor Krebs Trustees Wikman, Chamberlin and Wikman voting yes, none opposed to closing the public hearing.

Motion was made by Trustee Skelton, seconded by Trustee Chamberlin; carried, Mayor Krebs Trustees Skelton, Chamberlin and Wikman voting yes, none opposed to approving the below the 2018 CDBG application for the projects listed below.

AUTHORIZING RESOLUTION:

At a special meeting of the Village of Springville Board of Trustees held Wednesday, October 25, 2017, the Village Board authorized Mayor William Krebs to sign and submit the applications and to execute a contract with Erie County Development Block Grant Program for the following projects, upon approval of the Erie County Community Development. Projects are listed in order of preference. Funding from Erie County Development up to \$100,000 per project.

1. Well #1 Replacement – at an estimated cost of \$228,050.
2. Water main replacement project on N. Central Ave at an estimated cost of \$375,964.
3. Support of Rural Transit Service, Inc.

2. LL 2017-6 Chapter 110 Updates Mayor Krebs opened the public hearing regarding LL 2017-6, Chapter 110 – Amendments to Licenses and Permits. During discussion it was outlined that the background checks will cost \$150 per applicant annually (6/1 – 5/31) as well as required fingerprinting . Motion was made by Trustee Wikman, seconded by Trustee Skelton; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Skelton and Chamberlin voting yes, none opposed to closing the public hearing regarding the below amendments to Chapter 110.

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Motion was made by Trustee Wikman, seconded by Trustee Chamberlin; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Wikman, Chamberlin and Skelton voting yes, none opposed to approve Local Law 2017-6 as shown below;

Adopted Local Law 6 of 2017 –Amendments to Chapter 110- Licenses and Permits

Delete current Language Section 110-7 Applications – **The Village Board of Trustees shall approve, by resolution applications for licenses.**

Add new language Section 110-7 Applications – “No license shall be issued until an application has been first filed with the Village Administrator by the person seeking the same. Where a person makes application for himself and one or more helpers, applicable personal information specified on the application form shall be required to be given for each applicant and helper. An individual license shall be required by each party. No license issued under this article shall be transferable from one person to another. The application shall be issued from the Village Administrator’s office. The completed application may be referred to the Village of Springville Police for approval. The Village Administrator shall approve the licenses.”

Delete current Language Section 110-8 – A- Investigations – **The officers charged with the duty of performing the investigation shall make a report thereon to the Board of Trustees...**

Add new language Section 110-8 – A- Investigations - replace Board of Trustees with Village Administrator

Add new Language Section 110-8 Add Paragraph C-E

C. The police officer designated by the Officer in Charge to order and review criminal records (“Criminal Records Officer”) may cause the fingerprints of any applicant for a peddling or soliciting permit (license) and any applicable fee to be forwarded to the Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) in the form and manner as prescribed by DCJS for a complete criminal background and investigation upon receipt of the appropriate fee from the applicant.

D. The Criminal Records Officer, the Village Administrator and the Village Attorney shall review the criminal history record information (CHRI) disseminated by DCJS in connection with the applicant’s criminal background and investigation.

E. In making the determination of the applicant’s fitness for the requested permit (license), based upon the information provided by DCJS, New York State Correction Law Section 701 through 703b and Section 751 through 753 shall be given due consideration.

This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.

3. Adjourn Motion was made by Trustee Chamberlin, seconded by Trustee Wikman; carried, Mayor Krebs, Trustees Chamberlin, Wikman and Skelton voting yes, none opposed to adjourn the Special Meeting at 7:15 pm.
